Management Conference will be a showcase for 'experimental techniques' in conference communication," says Ammon. Instead, we feel the Institute should use this opportunity to develop a new format with new and different program ideas, and utilize speakers and workshop leaders who are among the very best in their respective fields and who for the most part are new to industry audiences."

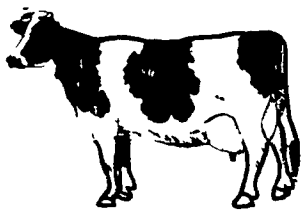
