

ta, Less coffee used by consumers

U.S. per capita food consumption dipped only slightly last year from the record high of 1976. Use of animal products remained virtually unchanged, while consumption of food from crops slipped 2 per cent as consumers drank 25 per cent less coffee in reaction to tight world supplies and

soaring prices. For 1978, economists see another slight decline in the overall food consumption index. Per capita use of food from crops may turn a bit higher, but not enough to offset a decline in the animal products category, led by reduced consumption of red meats.




