Allis-Chalmers wins two at Buck

THE BUCK - Two Allis -Chalmers Model 180 tractors and an A-C D-21 showed their power at the Buck Tractor pulls last week. The A-C D-21, driven by Marlin Brubaker of Quarryville, won the 7000 pound super stock class, while the two 180 niodels took the first two places in the 5000 pound super stock class. Dale Smoker of Cochranville piloted the winning tractor for a full pull of 300 feet, edging runner-up Jim Brubaker of Quarryville by a distance of just over six feet Rounding out the 5000 pound super stock class was Coleman Wheatley of Bethel, Del., who drove his John Deere 4010 for 285 feet, eight inches.

In the 7000 pound super stock class, Brubaker's D-21 outperformed Tony Stauffer's Deutz 9006 and Don Thomas' John Deere 4020. Stauffer, who hails from Ephrata, drove his machine for 267-9, while Thomas, from Boonesboro, Md., was stopped at 266-6.

In the 7000 pound modified class, Curt Stoltz of Myerstown registred a full pull. Placing second was Greg Manners of Ringoes, N.J. and Dick Zimmerman of Mt. Joy was third. Their respective disfances were 298-5 and 294-5

The sled stopped Eddie Horman of Frederick, Md. at 297 feet in the 9000 pound super stock class. He was aboard an IH 1466. Tony Stauffer was second with his Deutz, pulling for a disance of 273-5. The third position was taken by Don Thomas at 272-2.

In the 9000 pound open category, Galen Spickler of Elizabethtown charged for a full pull with his Allisonpowered machine. Two 440 cubic inch Dodge engines brought Greg Manners of Ringoes to 293-8 and a second place. Elwood Flowers of Manheim was third at 289-7 with his 454 Chevy.

Gary Mills of Fallston, Md. was the winner in the 5000 pound modified class, keeping the sled in tow for 270-4. Gene Spickler of Elizabethtown placed second at 267-1 and Charles Brommer of Columbia was third at 258-11.

In the 12,000 pound class, Harry Griest of Coatesville piloted his IH 1456 for a winning distance of 271-1. Galen Spickler and his Allison were second at 266-8 and Don Thomas skidded in for a third place aboard his John Deere.
