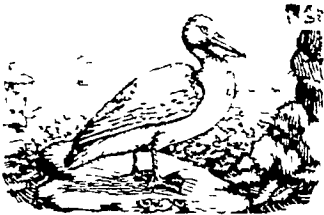

New England Fair and warm with scattered rain north to start then rainy and cooler at midweek, weekend sunny and warmer.

Greater New York-New Jersey Warm with light showers first part of week, then cool with scattered showers.

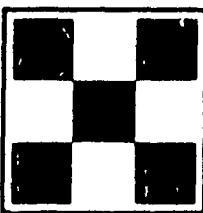
