WASHINGTON, D.C. -There were 551,939,561 bushels of feed grain and wheat in the grain reserve as of July 14, according to Ray Fitzgerald, administrator of the Agricultural Stablization and Conservation Service. As of that date, the reserve held 25,643,049 bushels of barley, 114,074,413 bushels of corn, 28,622,913 bushels of oats, 16,565,727 bushels of sorghum (9,276,807 hundredweight), and 367,033,459 bushels of wheat.
