reserve junior champion honor. It was largely one family show as the Maulfairs once again shut out the competition.

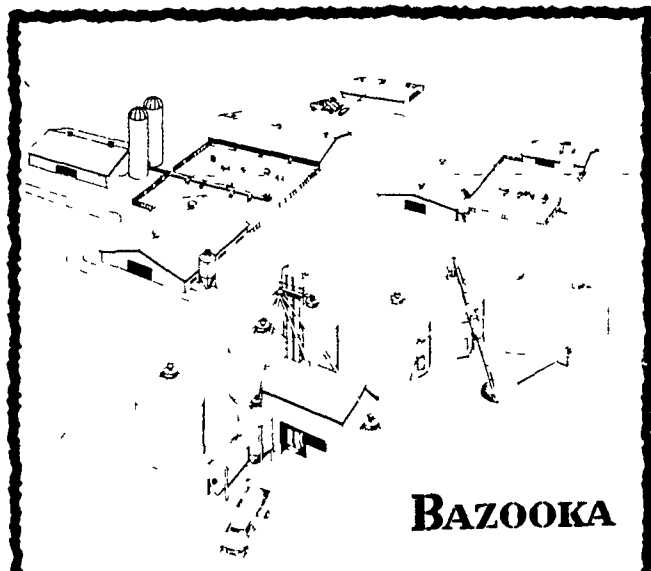
The only contest to spoil the Maulfairs' winning streak was Heather Healey of Lebanon who placed first

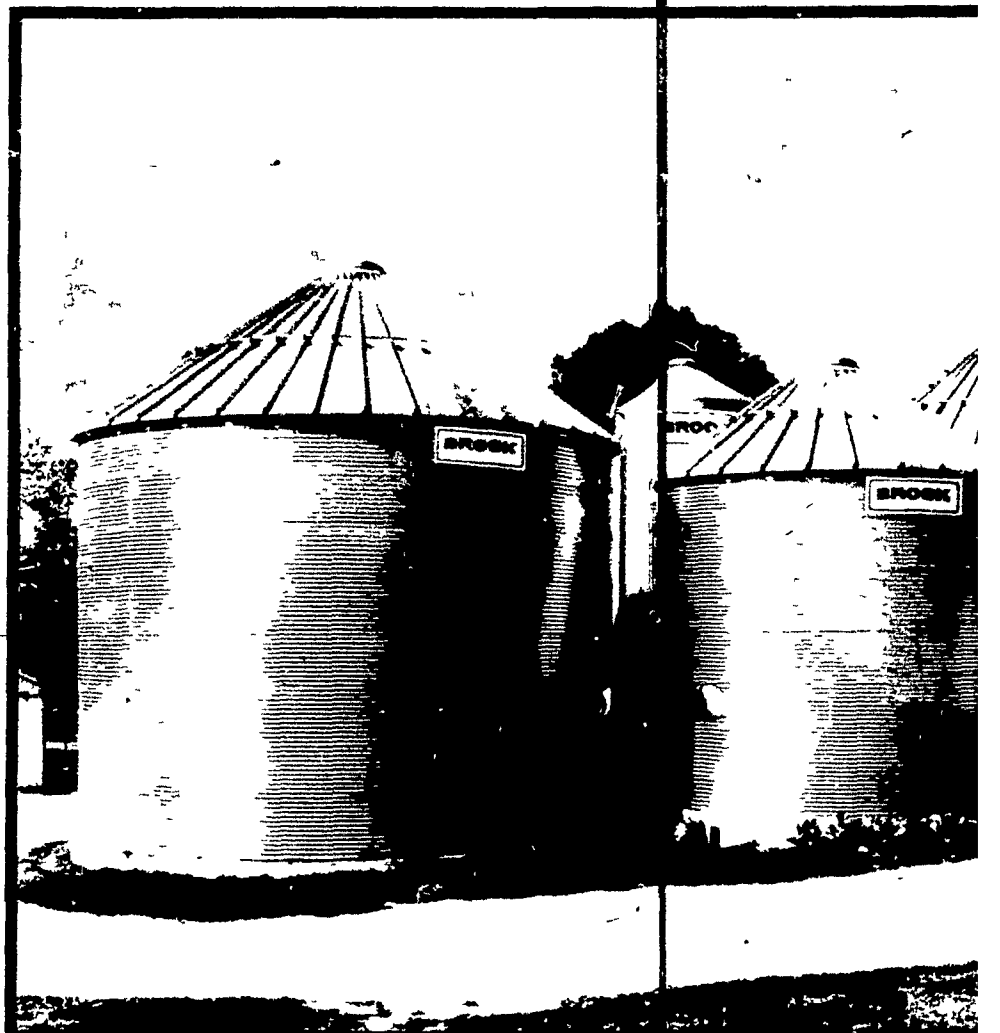
