Three Lancaster County 4-H'ers took part in Washington program

LANCASTER - Phillip Risser, Susan Frost, and Jody Henkel, all Lancaster County 4-H'ers, recently returned from Citizenship '78 - a week long living experience in Citizenship at

the National 4-H Center, Washington, D.C. They were three of 92 4-H members from Pennsylvania and ten other states who participated in the program designed to help young

people understand the structure and function of our system of government, the heritage of our country's development and individual roles in the nation's future.

Using the nation's capital as a "classroom" the program included a day on Capitol Hill to meet with members of Congress and see government in Action. Participants started off the day touring the Capitol and Supreme Court. Area 4-H'ers talked with Congressman Robert Walker, and Senator John Heinz.

Field trips to historical and cultural sites as well as visits to national agencies and organizations were among the most informative and exciting parts of the week, the Lancaster Countians said. According to Sue Frost, the Kennedy Center, Air and Space Museum and the Smithsonian History and Technology building were great experiences. "Torchtlight Tatroo" presented by the Old Guard and "The Wiz" followed by ice cream at Farrels were regarded as the best field trips of the week.

At workshops sessions in the National 4-H Center,

young people discussed contemporary issues and concerns, and ways in which skills and knowledge gained during the week could be applied to the 4-H program in Lancaster County.

One of the sessions showed how to overcome shyness in front of people and how to give a talk without any visual equipment. Other workshops gave ideas for learning about other people and how to meet other people in a large group.

Participants from different states gave the Lancaster 4-H'ers new ideas for fund-raising, new projects, job opportunities, and different opinions on any subject.

Citizenship '78 is conducted by the National 4-H Council in behalf of the Cooperative Extension Service of the State Land-Grant universities and U.S. Department of Agriculture. Three delegates from Lancaster County were selected on the basis of an application containing an essay on why they wished to attend Citizenship '78. The trip was partially funded by 4-H organizations and individual participants of the program.
