

Penn State agronomists honored

UNIVERSITY PARK — Agronomists from Penn State won all three awards for research, teaching, and Extension during meetings of the Northeastern Branch of the American Society of Agronomy held recently at the University of Connecticut.

The research award went to Richard R. Hill, Jr., adjunct professor of plant breeding and agronomist with the Regional Pasture Research Laboratory of the U.S. Department of Agriculture at University Park. Leon J. Johnson, associate professor of soil mineralogy, received the teaching award. The Extension-industry award went to W. Wayne Hinish,

professor of agronomy extension.

The society honors three agronomists each year for exceptional contributions to agronomic science, education, and service. Winners receive certificates. Dr. Johnson was leader of a course improvement project which led to development of a unique study guide and laboratory manual for introductory soil science. This manual has been accepted for publication by a national textbook publisher.

Dr. Hill has become a leading authority on alfalfa breeding and quantitative genetics. The award

described Dr. Hill's research as "giving geneticists and plant breeders a much better insight into the kinds and magnitudes of gene actions in plants with complex genetic system." He was also cited for developing principles important to improve the effectiveness of plant breeding procedures.

Dr. Hinish has been responsible for the Pennsylvania Soil Testing Program since 1956. In 1967, he developed a new program that combined soil test values plus soil physical characteristics and soil survey information into a package for determining lime and fertilizer recommendations. At this time Dr. Hinish computerized the

program. He also designed a unique test result and treatment recommendation report form that is now used in several states.
