APPLE PUDDING

2½ tablespoons butter 2 cups sliced apples ¼ cup granulated sugar 1 teaspoon nutmeg 1/4 cup butter

½ cup granulated sugar 1 egg 1 cup sifted flour

11/2 teaspoons.baking powder 1/4 teaspoon salt 1/3 cup buttermilk or sour milk

1 teaspoon vanilla

Melt butter in baking pan. Remove from heat and butter sides of pan. Place apples in butter pan. Mix sugar and nutmeg and sprinkle over apples. Cream butter and sugar together thoroughly. Add egg and beat well. Add to creamed mixture the buttermilk and vanilla, alternately with the dry ingredients. Pour batter over apples and bake uncovered at 375°F. for 35 minutes or until apples test done. Invert on serving dish and serve warm. Or serve

cold with spiced whipped

cream or ice cream. Serves six.

brown) ½ cup shortening 1 egg 1 cup flour ½ teaspoon salt ½ teaspoon baking powder 1 cup applesauce 1 teaspoon baking soda ½ teaspoon cloves

1 teaspoon cinnamon 1 teaspoon allspice
