The increasing rate of coronary heat disease in the United States during the 60 years between 1913 and 1973 has often been blamed on meat consumption. But consumption of animal fats declined by nine per cent in that period, while vegetable fat consumption increased

three-fold, said Pearson.

not prove, that vegetable fats contributed to the increased rate, according to Pearson.

Flesh foods (meat, fish, poultry) make their major contribution by supplying an abundance of high quality protein and appreciable amounts of vitamins and minerals, Pearson pointed out. It is nearly impossible to obtain the recommended daly allowance of Vitamin B12 without including flesh foods in the diet.

practical method of decreasing the number of calories from fat in the diet would be to reduce reduce total caloric intake "since a reduction in fat content could be easily counterbalanced by increasing carbohydrate consumption." He said scientific evidence suggests that reducing total fat consumption - vegetable as well as animal fat - may help in controlling obesity and in reducing both coronary heart disease and cancer.


