## **Bergland notes** transition time in his report to the **President**


WASHINGTON, D.C. -The "Report of the Secretary of Agriculture 1977," just released, said that 1977 began a period of transition for the American farmer. After three straight years of large world harvests, farmers felt far removed from the period of strong prices and unlimited production that domestic and foreign shortfalls brought during 1972-75. World and U.S. ag conditions in 1977, were much different and set the stage for the Food and Ag. Act of 1977, which the Secretary said has had a favorable impact on farm economic conditions and that net farm income for 1978 should be as much as 24 per cent higher than in 1977.
