Crumb Topping

½ cup butter
½ cup granulated sugar
1 teaspoon flour

Peel, core and slice apples into eighths. Arrange apples in pastry lined pie plate. Mix sugar and cinnamon together. Pour over apples. Dot with butter. To make crumb topping cream butter and sugar together. Cut in flour until mixture is crumbly. Cover top of pie with the mixture. Bake at 400°F. 50 to 60 minutes.

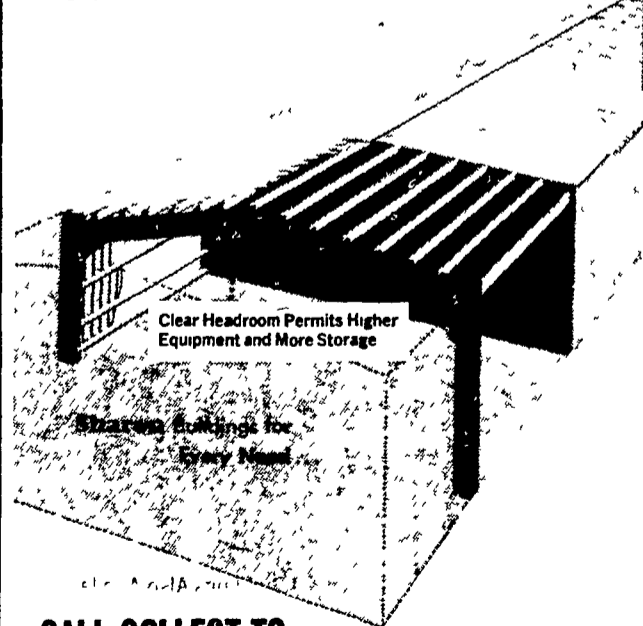

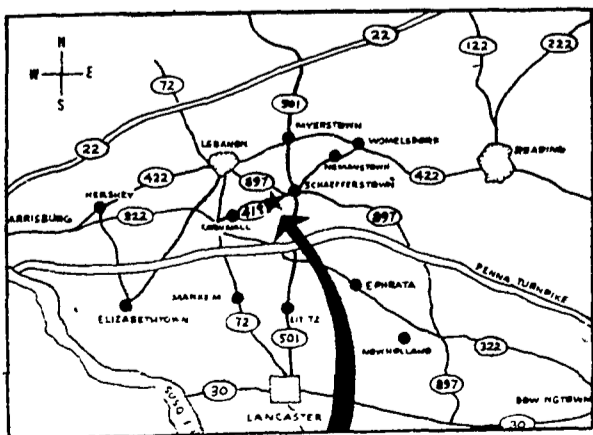

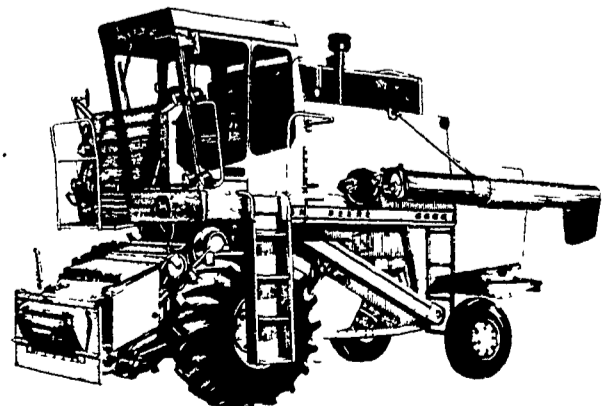
