Conestoga Trail open

LANCASTER — A 15-mile hiking trail that runs along Pequea Creek and the Susquehanna River has been completed.

Constructed by the Lancaster Hiking Club, the Conestoga Trail runs along the rim of the River Hills overlooking the Lake Aldred Gorge in the Susquehanna River.

Beginning at Martic Forge on Route 324 near Pequea, the trail ends at Lock 12 historic area on the York County side of Lake Aldred. The trail is mostly on land owned by Pennsylvania Power & Light Co.

"Rocky overlooks along the wooded trail provide views of the river below", said George Aukamp, PP&L's Lake Aldred superintendent. "This is a

rugged trail for experienced hikers, although there is less difficult section along Pequea Creek which follows a trolley bed past the Colemanville covered bridge."

Among the highlights of the Conestoga Trail are a house-size rock, a cleft in the rocks and stands of hemlock, rhododendron and tulip poplar. The trail passes through Pequea Creek campground, Pinnacle Overlook, Holtwood ballfield and Face Rock Overlook, all PP&L recreation areas at Lake Aldred.

The trail, marked by orange blazes, is open to the public. Trail maps are available from Aukamp at the lake superintendent's office, Holtwood, Pa. 17532 or by phoning 717-284-2278.

WHAT'S NEW

GRAIN MOISTURE TESTER

A recent electronic breakthrough has made possible a grain moisture instrument that features simplicity, accuracy and speed at an affordable cost, says the manufacturer. The new Nova Grain Moisture Sensor 7000 is a portable battery operated instrument that is held in one hand. Percent moisture is indicated as a direct meter readout that is automatically temperature compensated - there is no need to reference the reading to multiple scales or conversion charts.



The probe is simply inserted into the grain sample, the grain type set on the selector knob, and the moisture percentage is read directly from the meter.

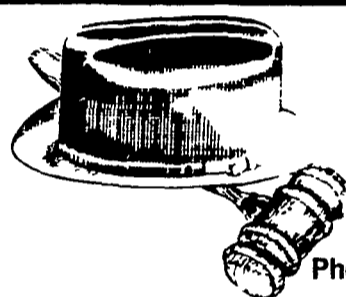
