

# Nat. Farm Women's Forum Nov. 28-30

MILWAUKEE, Wis. — Farm and ranch women from all over the country will be meeting in Milwaukee, Wis., Nov. 28 to 30 for the National Farm Women's Forum. About 2,000 women are expected to attend.

"Today's Farm Woman: The Vital Link" is the theme for this year's Forum program, emphasizing the contemporary farm woman's function as a homemaker as well as a "partner in agriculture."

Included will be a program on meats by "The Butcher", Merle Ellis of Tiburon, Calif., who has a nationally syndicated television show and newspaper column; "Dairy Delights for the Holidays" by the American Dairy Association of Wisconsin; "Decorating on the Rural Route" by interior designer Gordon Cremers of Minneapolis; and a sewing-with-knits program by Stretch 'N' Sew.

Three agricultural headliners will "Face the Nation's Farm Women" on Thursday, Nov. 30, addressing the group briefly, then responding to questions from the rural women. Speakers will be USDA Assistant Secretary Carol Foreman; Ellen Haas, Director, Consumer Division, Community Nutrition Institute in Washington D.C.; and Rep. Tom Foley (unconfirmed), Chairman of the House Agriculture Committee.

"Ag Boosters Review" will highlight farm women's successful projects promoting agriculture and farm products. A "Natural Fibers and Hides" style show will feature fashions made from pigoede, wool, cotton and leather.

"Cutting out the Middleman" will be the subject for a panel discussing direct marketing of farm products.

Panelists will be Sue Zimmerman, a beef producer from Fond du Lac, Wis.; Marilyn Thompson, a strawberry grower from Bristol, Wis.; and Ed Watkins, Extension specialist from Washington, D.C.

Dr. Dick Vilstrup, professor of agricultural economics at the University of Wisconsin, Madison, will conduct a seminar on how to make the most of membership in farm organizations and cooperatives.

An estate planning team made up of an attorney, an accountant and an insurance man will suggest ways to organize farm estates.

The Forum closing session, "Sharing and Caring Back Home" will feature Dr. Gail Imig,

assistant director, University of Kansas Cooperative Extension Service.

A new "Rural Talent Review" will feature music and entertainment by farm wives, ranging from singing to Hawaiian dancing to clowning.

The WGN "Noon Show" with farm broadcaster Orion Samuelson will originate live from the Forum on Nov. 28.

Entertainment at the Forum Banquet on Nov. 29, will be by The Silo Singers from East Lansing, Mich.

Forum registration is \$30 per person for the three day's activities, or \$15 for a single day.

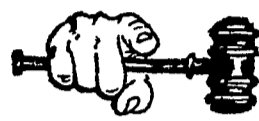
