will compete for awards at the national level. Support of the veterinary science project is provided by the Upjohn Company. David, who was picked from among the 145,000 youth who annually take part in the Extension Service educational 4-H program, is the son of Mr. and Mrs. J. Calvin Sammons. He is a senior at the Shenango Area Junior Senior High School. He has been a 4-H member for 10 years. A member of three Lawrence County 4-H Clubs, David served as president and vice president. He also assisted with club activities and events as a teen leader. The state veterinary science winner completed projects in two units of veterinary science, swine breeding, and feeding, sheep

Locally, he took part in officers training, roundup, 4-H development committee, and achievement night.

He also participated in the Regional 4-H Teen Leaders Retreat, District 4-H Camp, State 4-H Capital Days, Pennsylvania Association of Farmer Cooperatives Summer Youth Institute, American Institute of Cooperation, Pennsylvania 4-H Leadership Congress, State 4-H Achievement Days, and Citizenship Short Course.
