

... Tractor operators under 15 and over 64 have seven to 10 times more accidents per hour of machine use than operators in the 25 to 44 age group.

...Fifty per cent of the victims of wagon accidents are injured in falls.

...Farm elevators have one of the highest accident rates. Almost half of the accidents involve getting caught in moving parts, and nearly three out of four of these injuries involve fingers and hands.

...Study the Operator's Manual prepared by the manufacturer of a machine and follow its recommendations on adjustment, opera-


tions, lubrication and safety. ...Harvest corn as soon as it is ready.

...Maintain ground speed according to crop and field conditions, and keep the header centered on the row.

.Be safety-conscious at all times by keeping all and having a fire exshields in place; stopping tinguisher readily available.
