

One-fourth of farm accidents take place during harvests

COLLEGE PARK, Md. — Over one-fourth of all farm accidents occur during September and October. So now is the time to think about these safety measures and to do something in the name of accident prevention. If you wait until next month, it probably won't get

done, say safety programmers at the University of Maryland.

Take time to zero-in on machine hazards and effective countermeasures. Consider the following facts:

...One-half of the reported combine-related injuries oc-

cur in the field, and fingers are lost in 38 per cent of these injuries.

...Tractor operators under 15 and over 64 have seven to 10 times more accidents per hour of machine use than operators in the 25 to 44 age group.

...Fifty per cent of the victims of wagon accidents are injured in falls.

...Farm elevators have one of the highest accident rates. Almost half of the accidents involve getting caught in moving parts, and nearly three out of four of these injuries involve fingers and hands.

You can have an accident-free harvest season this year

if you make safety important. Consider the following recommendations for a safe and trouble-free harvest season:

...Study the Operator's Manual prepared by the manufacturer of a machine and follow its recommendations on adjustment, opera-

tions, lubrication and safety.

...Harvest corn as soon as it is ready.

...Maintain ground speed according to crop and field conditions, and keep the header centered on the row.

...Be safety-conscious at all times by keeping all shields in place; stopping

machine before leaving operator's seat to clean, adjust, or lubricate; keeping hands, feet, and clothing away from moving parts; observing rest stops, particularly during mid-morning and mid-afternoon and having a fire extinguisher readily available.

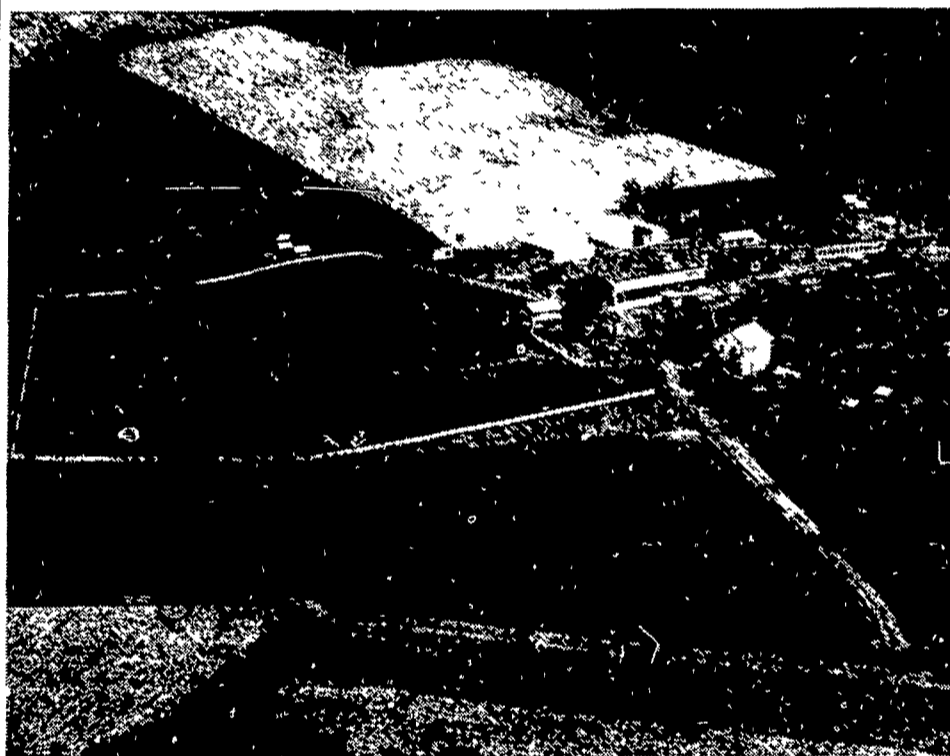
Workshop set
