A member of the Lebanon County 4-H Entomology Club and Happy Variety 4-H Club, he served as vice president, game leader, news reporter, and historian. He also assisted with club activities and events as a teen leader. Bruce completed projects in entomology, teen

leadership, geology, flower gardening, home improvement, forestry, and landscaping.

Locally, he took part in 4-H promotion week, teen council, officers training, olympic day committee, and leadership school.

Bruce also participated in State 4-H Achievement Days, State 4-H Capital Days, Pennsylvania 4-H Leadership Congress, and Farm Show.

He was selected as Lebanon County's Outstanding 4-H Boy and won county 4-H awards in leadership and entomology.

Commenting on the values of the educational youth program, Bruce said: "4-H has taught me how to work with others. It has also given me confidence when speaking to groups."
