has played an important factor in breeding the feed efficient birds we have today, Blass continued. The



broiler meat has gone from 4.5 pounds of feed in 1948 to two pounds of feed today. Chicken cooking contests also played an important role, also helping to increase the amount of poultry consumption per person.

Rudy Von Dohren, another pioneer in chicken barbeqeuing, also reminisced about the early barbequeing days, explaining how the associatin got their first grills and how quickly their recipe of vinegar, water, butter, and salt became so popular the demand for their chickens was too great for the area poultrymen to handle.


