

Rifle Show, seminars set for Nov. 4 and 5

LANCASTER - A special event featuring Kentucky rifles and other colonial weapons will be held in the Lancaster area on November 4 and 5. The

program will take place at two locations: a show and sale at the Neffsville Community Fire Hall and two seminars at the Pennsylvania Farm Museum of

Landis Valley. Both parts of the program will be open to the public.

The goal of the program is to acquaint participants with colonial weapons and ac-

cessories. Collectors, muzzle-loading enthusiasts, and any other interested individuals are invited to attend.

The seminars at the Farm Museum will be held on November 4 at 4 p.m. and 7 p.m. The earlier seminar will be an informal program at the Museum's Gun Shop and will focus on the craft of the gunsmith. Several working gunsmiths will demonstrate selected aspects of the craft. Charles Heistand of Marietta and Reaves Goehring of Columbia will work at the gun shop forge demonstrating the hand-forging of a gun barrel. Stanley Hollenbaugh of East Berlin, Robert Wheeler of Dundalk, Maryland, and Jack Spotz of York will demonstrate other aspects of gunsmithing.

The second seminar

session will be held in the Farm Museum's auditorium at 7 p.m. This session will focus on the repair and restoration of antique Kentucky rifles. A panel of experts will discuss various aspects of repair and restoration and members of the audience will be encouraged to participate. Panel members will include Charles Heistand, Stanley Hollenbaugh, Robert Wheeler, Kit Ravenshear of Benton, Pa., and William Bankard of Baltimore.

Tickets for the seminars will be \$2, entitling ticket-holders to attend both sessions.

The Pennsylvania Farm Museum is located on the Oregon Pike (Route 272) about four miles north of Lancaster. It is an outdoor museum of Pennsylvania rural life featuring over 20

exhibit buildings and approximately 100 acres of grounds. The museum will also be open to the general public both days of the Kentucky rifle program.

The Kentucky Rifle Show and Sale will be held at the Neffsville Community Fire Hall from 8 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. on November 4 and 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. on November 5. The show will feature exhibits of Kentucky rifles and accessories, colonial weapons, Indian trade goods, Bowie knives, and colonial clothing.

The show will also be open from 8:30 to 10 p.m. on Saturday, November 4 for dealers and seminar ticket-holders.

Admission to the show and sale will be \$1 per person.

The Neffsville Community Fire Hall is located on Route 722, approximately 1 block east of Route 501 in Neffsville, PA.

Chairman for the seminar is Reaves Goehring of Columbia. Goehring is a teacher and an avid collector and gunsmith. Working with him is John E. Holman, Jr. of Elizabethtown. For information or seminar tickets, one can contact Holman at Elizabethtown R2, Pa. 17022 or telephone 717(944)6274.

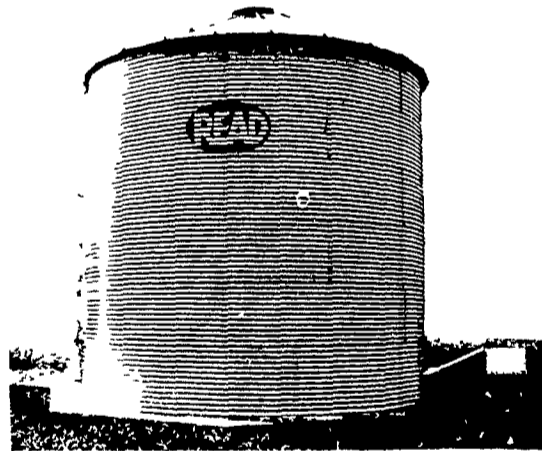

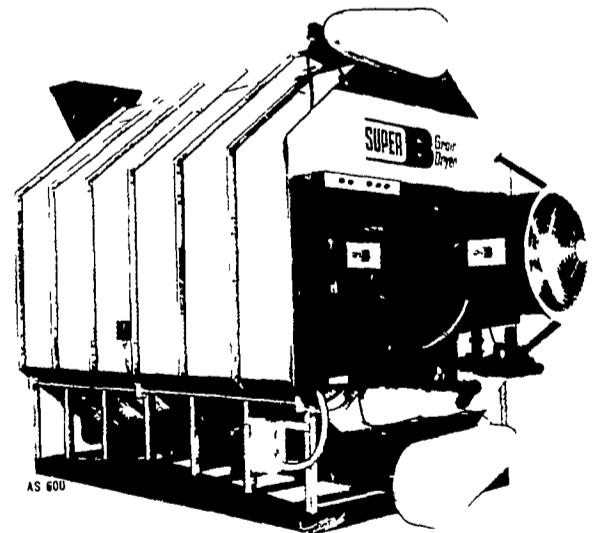
