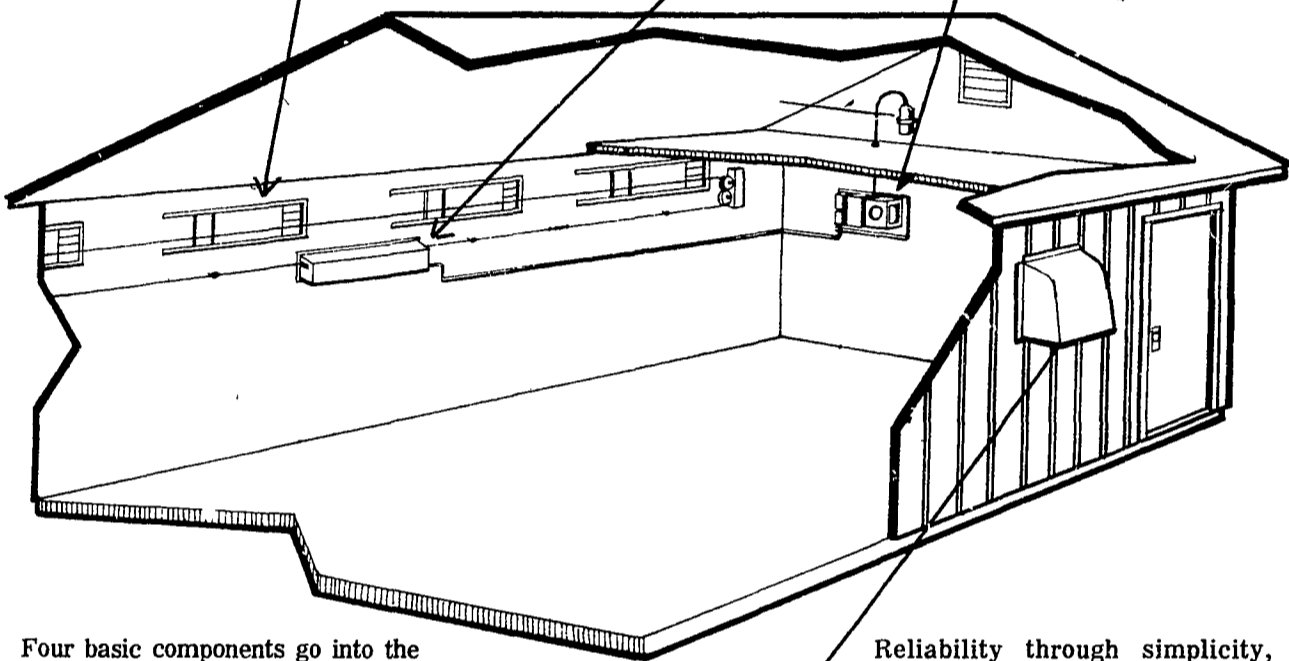
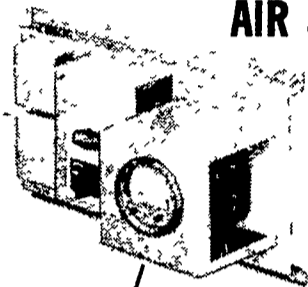
INLET POWER PACK

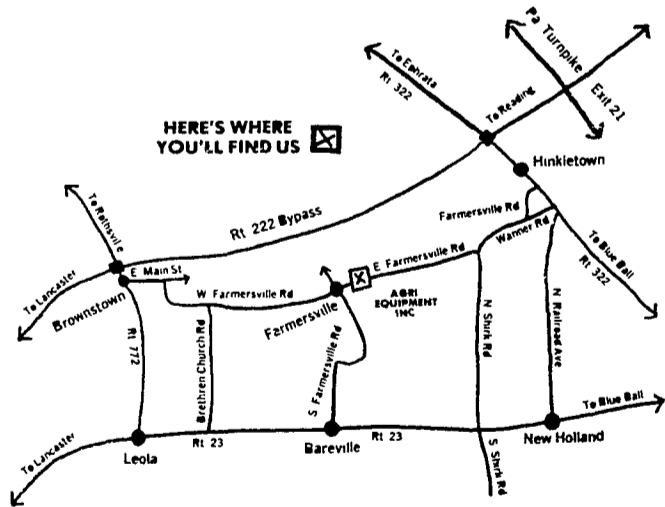

Commodity Marketing Symposium in Chicago. He also was recipient of the 4-H "I Dare You" Award.

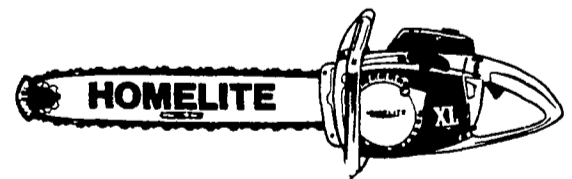
