

Milk support price at \$9.64

WASHINGTON, D.C. - Secretary of Agriculture Bob Bergland has announced that the support price for manufacturing milk will be \$9.64 per hundredweight for the new marketing year which began Oct. 1. The announced price is for milk with a milkfat content of 3.5 per cent and compares with the old support of \$9.21. The support price for milk with the U.S. annual average milkfat content of 3.67 per cent is now \$9.87, compared with the old support of \$9.43.

The law requires that milk

be supported at a level between 80 and 90 per cent of parity to assure an adequate supply of milk, reflect changes in the cost of production and assure a level of farm income adequate to maintain productive capacity sufficient to meet anticipated future needs.

The support for milk is achieved by purchases of butter, cheese and nonfat dry milk at prices which enable manufacturing plants, on the average, to pay producers the support price for their milk.

'World' reaches milestone

SANDY CREEK, N.Y. - With the close of 1978, the Holstein-Friesian World, official publication for the Holstein breed in the U.S., will have completed 75 years of service to the registered Holstein industry. To commemorate the occasion, the World will publish a special Diamond Jubilee issue on January 10, 1979, recapping some of the highlights of Holstein history over the years.

The first issue of Holstein-Friesian World appeared on January 1, 1904. It may be of interest that the present editor and managing editor are the son and grandson respectively of one of the World's founders. Also, the publisher is the son of the late M. S. Prescott, World editor from 1914 until his death in 1976.
