Piper was honored at PAFC's annual meeting October 18 in Gettysburg. He also received an expensepaid trip to the annual meeting of the American Institute of Cooperation held in Montana July.

The Adams County agent was cited for his educational programs with area cooperatives and county agricultural organizations.

Piper conducted training sessions for directors and managers of farmer

Thomas E. Piper cooperatives and warehouse supervisors on principles of work simplification as applied to materials handling. He also conducts milk marketing workshops, commodity outlook meetings, and training on all aspects of direct marketing.

The Adams County agent

assists with educational and Adams meetings held by Atlantic Fruitgrowers Association, Breeders Cooperative, Inter-State Milk Producers Cooperative, Knouse Foods Cooperative, Mountain Cooperative, Orchards Electřic Adams Cooperative, Musselmen's, and Mott, Inc.

He worked closely with officials of the Maryland Cooperative Milk Producers in establishing a district within Adams County in

Piper aided 12 farmers in gaining recognition as Pennsylvania Master Farmers. He also assisted in the interpretation of research and the adoption of new agricultural technology. In 1975, the value of Adams County farm products sold amounted to \$56 million.

The award recipient is responsible for the supervision of the county Dairy Improvement Association testing program, serves as an exofficio member of the Adams County Holstein Association


