

Huff gets \$7310 for hog at ENLS

TIMONIUM, Md. — A 215-pound Hampshire, shown by Danny Hoff, of Manchester, Md., was selected grand champion market hog of the 32nd annual Eastern National Livestock Show held at the Maryland State Fair Grounds October 4 to 8.

The hog, judged the best in the 4-H Club and Future Farmers of America contest, was sold at auction for \$34 per pound to Bob Evans Farms, Inc. of Columbus, Ohio.

The reserve champion market Hog, a Hampshire, was shown by Michelle Rose, of Rockville, Md. The 245-pound animal was bought at auction for \$10.05 per pound by the Hatfield Packing Company, of Hatfield, Pa.

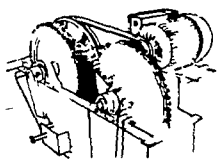

The Patz Mechanical Manure Pump is designed to handle manure ranging from semi-solid to free-flowing slurry.

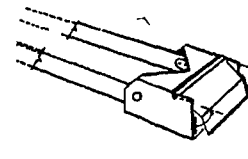


The Patz Slurry Manure Pump provides the ultimate solution to the moving of slurry liquid manure from dairy, beef, hogs or poultry installations to manure storage facilities.

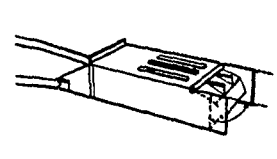
The new Patz Slurry Pump can move slurry and liquids up to 150 feet. The manure is supplied to an underground hopper with a gutter cleaner or scraper and is forced into a 12 inch P.V.C. pipe by means of an 8 inch by 15 inch plunger.



A 10 hp electric motor running a roller chain reduction unit drives the plunger at a rate of 21 strokes per minute. The Patz exclusive roller chain drive unit is the most efficient way to transmit a smooth flow of power.

The 8 inch by 15 inch plunger has a one way valve in the sleeve which closes on the forward stroke forcing the manure into the storage facility and opens on the backward stroke for the next load.



Plunger sleeve can be removed from sleeve chamber for servicing without breaking out concrete. Valve in the sleeve and hopper valve at the end of the pipe prevent manure from returning.
