

## Manheim Fair closes with sale of livestock

By KENDACE BORRY MANHEIM — The parade of animals through the sales ring at the last night of the Manheim Community Farm Show included the champion hog, sheep, and steer shown at the fair held previously last week. Due to the inclement weather, the sale was moved inside the livestock tent.

the champion hog which had been shown by Beth Chapman, 15, of Dutch Valley Farms, was sold for \$2.10 per pound and bought by the Hatfield Packing Company, Hatfield. The total price of the 220 pound animal was \$462. Hatfield Packing Company bought a total of 31 lots of the 61 lots of hogs sold at the sale.

The reserve champion hog, was exhibited by Rick Strauss, Ephrata R1, and hisbrothers, Robert, and Steve. The animal was bought by Walter Dunlap, Jr., of the Lancaster Stockyards. The hog brought \$1.47 per pound, for a total price of \$233.69.

A total of 150 head of hogs were sold for a total sale of \$20,050.75. The average price per hog was 62.45 cents per pound.
