Pa. nursery, dealer gross receipts up

HARRISBURG - Gross receipts of the Commonwealth's 3,591 certified nurseries and dealers in 1977 totaled \$206.1 million, according to a report released by the Pennsylvania Crop Reporting Service.

The 1977 gross receipts were 43 per cent higher than those in 1975. The survey is done every other year.

Retail sales accounted for about 65 per cent of the total receipts. Certified nurseries accounted for 55 per cent of that total while the remaining 45 per cent was received by certified dealers in nursery products.

Overall, 37 per cent of the products sold were selfgrown, 33 per cent were purchased within Pennsylvania, and 30 per cent were purchased from other states.

During 1977 the nursery industry employed 12,771 workers, up seven per cent from 1975. An additional 3,133 unpaid family members worked for the industry.

Salaries and wages paid totaled \$47.9 million, up 13 per cent from 1975, while expenditures for fee or contract services such as fertilizing, spraying, etc., totaled \$2.8 million, up 27 per

cent from the previous survey.

The 1977 market value of land, structures and equipment used in Pennsylvania's nursery industry totaled \$209.8 million, an increase of 25 per cent from 1975. Land used by nursery operations during 1977 totaled 33,695 acres, down 24 per cent from 1975. This total includes land planted for certified nursery stock plus work areas and other land related to the operation. Land used by operators of nursery enterprises for all agricultural operations including nursery totaled 107,720 acres, down 13 per cent.

Greenhouse area totaled 6.6 million square feet, cold frames covered 4.7 million square feet, shaded areas covered 5.8 million square feet and sales and storage

sheds covered 3.0 million square feet.

At the request of the Nursery Marketing Advisory Council, the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture agreed to fund a Nursery Industry Survey. Since a complete enumeration was financially infeasible, a probability sample survey was conducted for the Department by the Pennsylvania Crop Reporting Service. A sample of 200 nurseries and 108 dealers was selected from a list of nursery operations maintained by the Department's Bureau of Plant Industry.

Hunting permission urged

HARRISBURG—Hunters this year are again being urged by the Pennsylvania Game Commission to ask for permission before hunting on private land.

In recent years a growing number of landowners have complained to the Game Commission that too many hunters went onto private property without first receiving permission to do so. As part of its SPORT program (Sportsmen Policing Our Ranks Together), the Game Commission is asking that hunting without permission be discontinued.

Many of the complaining landowners, who are now

participating in the SPORT program, indicate that they have no objection to hunting or hunters, but they would like to be shown just a little courtesy and consideration.

In most cases, permission to hunt will be readily granted if it is sought by responsible persons wearing SPORT buttons.

Farmers, particularly, are harvesting crops, and would like to know where hunters are on their property. And hunters should stay out of unharvested fields.

The alternative to asking for permission before hunting is often posted land, on which no one is permitted to hunt.

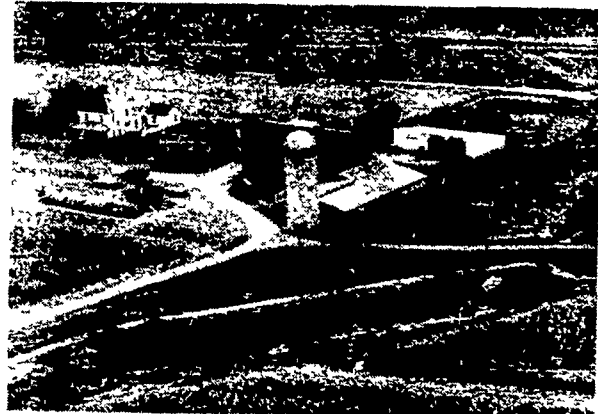
