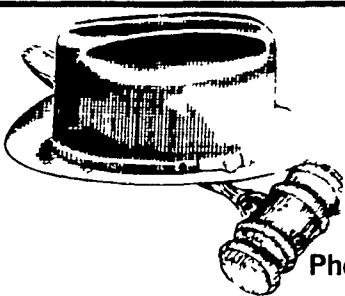

BOOKS ON CONCRETE FLOORS
