

Carter fails as inflation fighter

Many of you heard President Carter deliver his address to the American people last week in which he outlined his plan for dealing with the economy and inflation. The President should be praised for the attitude he displayed when he spoke about the pressing need to cut the cost of government

and move toward reductions of the federal deficit.

However, in my opinion, the President's plan does not go far enough even though it is on the right track. He spoke of reducing the federal budget deficit to 30 billion dollars. What he should be attempting to do is balance the federal budget immediately in order to effectively fight inflation.

At the very least, federal

spending must be cut back to the point that it is growing no faster than the rate of inflation. Under no circumstances should government be permitted to grow faster than our economy which will be the case when we are faced with a 30 billion dollar budget deficit despite the fact that this figure is a reduction from the current deficit levels. Until the Carter Administration agrees to limit the growth of government to a level compatible with the rest of the economy, government will remain as a major part of the inflation problem.

The wage and price guidelines proposed by the President will be very bad for the average working American. It is important to note that "guidelines with sanctions" really equal controls. While working Americans face wage controls of this nature, which I totally oppose, there will be no controls on rent, interest rates, food or foreign oil because, and I agree, controls in these areas are impossible to implement and enforce. But it means that while workers' wages are frozen, the cost of living will go up. The result will be that

the artificial wage level proposed by the President will be in unfair competition with inflation. Working people already carrying the inflation burden will be hit even harder.

While the President's proposals may have sounded good on the surface, in fact they will amount to increased government economic regulation and an increased role for government in our economic future.

In order to squeeze compliance to the guidelines out of a business community, new regulations and government oversight will have to be a part of the President's program.

In other words, the President's proposals amount to big government solutions to a problem caused by big government. It is time we look instead to solutions which promise and deliver less government.

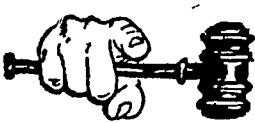

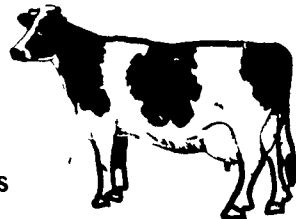
