Gas rationing changes urged

WASHINGTON, D.C. - U.S. Senator Richard S. Schweiker (R.-Pa.) has urged the Department of Energy to reconsider its proposed denial of priority rating to newspapers under its contingency gasoline rationing plan.

Under the Energy Policy

and Conservation Act of 1974, the Department of Energy was directed to formulate a contingency gasoline rationing program for standby use in case of a future energy emergency, such as a major oil embargo.

As part of that plan, DOE published in the Federal Register proposed regulations that included priority rating, in case of rationing, for certain gasoline users, such as emergency vehicles and public transportation. News gathering and distribution, however, were excluded from that priority use category.

"I trust the contingency

gasoline rationing program which the Department of Energy will submit to the Congress will correct this situation," Schweiker wrote.

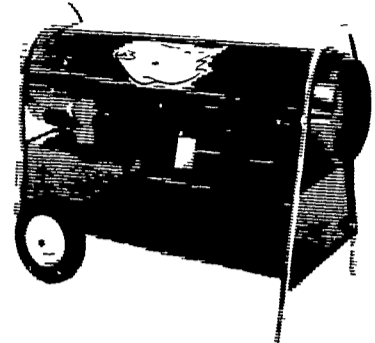
