Other members of the Pennsylvania livestock judging team were Wayne Hess of Manor who won a silver medal, and Frank Miller of Mercer County who garnered the bronze award. In swine showmanship, a team from Manor High School received bronze medal distinction. He was Steve McMichael of Willow Street R1. Another Penn State youth, Richard Jones, Columbia R3, won a

bronze emblem in sheep showmanship.

Ramon Hunt, a third Penn Manor FFA'er, won a silver emblem in the meats judging contest.

Pennsylvania's farm management team also fared well. High man on the 3-man team was the Mifflinburg Chapter's Tom Mincemoyer who took 19th place as an individual and earned a gold medal. The Pennsylvania team placed 12th in state competition. Axel Linde of Solanco High School earned a silver medal with his 35th individual placing and Steve Reichard of Mifflinburg won a bronze emblem.

The 51st annual convention of the Future Farmers of America was also the occasion for bestowing top
