Pen-Hort Society to meet

NEWARK, Del. - The Peninsula Horticulture Society will hold its annual meeting December 4 and 5 this year, at the Wicomico Civic Center in Salisbury.

As is customary, the Monday session will be devoted to vegetable crops, while Tuesday's program will cover greenhouse and ornamental crops. Sessions both days start at 9:30 a.m. and last until about 3 p.m., with an hour-and-a-half break for lunch.

Included in the vegetable program will be a presentation by a representative of the United Fresh Fruit and

Vegetable Association on the packaging and marketing of fresh fruit and vegetables.

There will also be a panel discussion on economical production of vegetable transplants, plus talks on vegetable production with plastics, and new pesticides. Another highlight of the Monday program will be a talk by Al Evans, executive director of the Maryland Food Dealers Association, on "The Potential for Vegetable Marketing on the Delmarva Peninsula.'

Tuesday's program will include a discussion by Dr. Robert Aldrich of Penn State University on the most economical greenhouse

design - from the standpoint of overall energy, labor, and space efficiency.

Other topics to be covered on the Dec. 5 include: ways to irrigate greenhouse crops, home garden design for energy conservation, and fertilization and liming of new and established plantings. Norman Cannon, a plant producer from Greenwood, Del., will talk on new and tested landscape plants for the Delmarva area.

The meeting is free and open to the public. No advanced registration is required. For further information one can contact his county Extension office.
