TROPICAL PUDDING

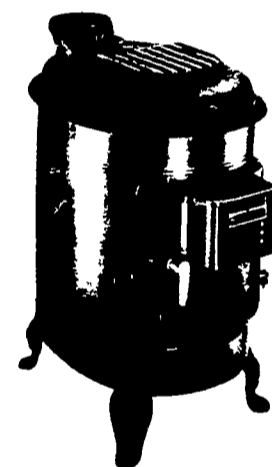

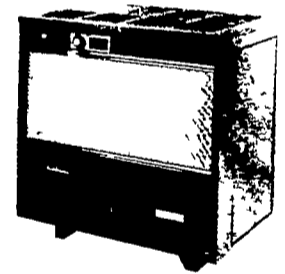
