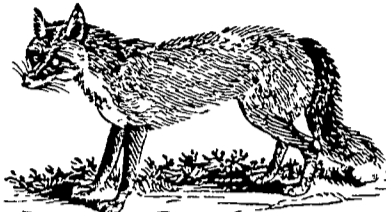

New England Cloudy and cold with flurries to midweek then snowstorm, showers for weekend
Greater New York-New Jersey Cold snap with light sleet and snow to start, then freezing rain midweek, partly sunny weekend
Middle Atlantic Coastal Week begins with rain or freezing rain fair weekend, scattered showers
Piedmont & Southeast Coastal Sunny seasonal throughout the week with some showers north and west
Florida: Few showers north at first of week, then clear through week's end
Upstate NY-Toronto & Montreal Snow, then cold with light rain and sleet for last of week

Rocky Mountain: Clear and cold south rain and snow north then clear north rain or snow south
Southwest Desert Partly cloudy with scattered showers to start, then sunny and pleasant for remainder of week
Pacific Northwest Week begins with rain, then partly sunny and cold midweek on
