HARRISBURG - Pennsylvania's hunters are reminded by the Game Commission that seasons for nearly all wild birds and wild animals will be closed during the regular firearms seasons for deer November 27 to December 9 and December 14 to 16.

During the regular firearms deer season, the only species that may be lawfully bunted are deer and migratory game birds which are still "in season." Rac-coons may also be hunted between sunset and one-half hour before sunrise during the firearms deer seasons.

The ban on hunting most species in deer seasons started in 1974. It is designed to prevent shooters from hunting for a second deer after having taken their first whitetail.
