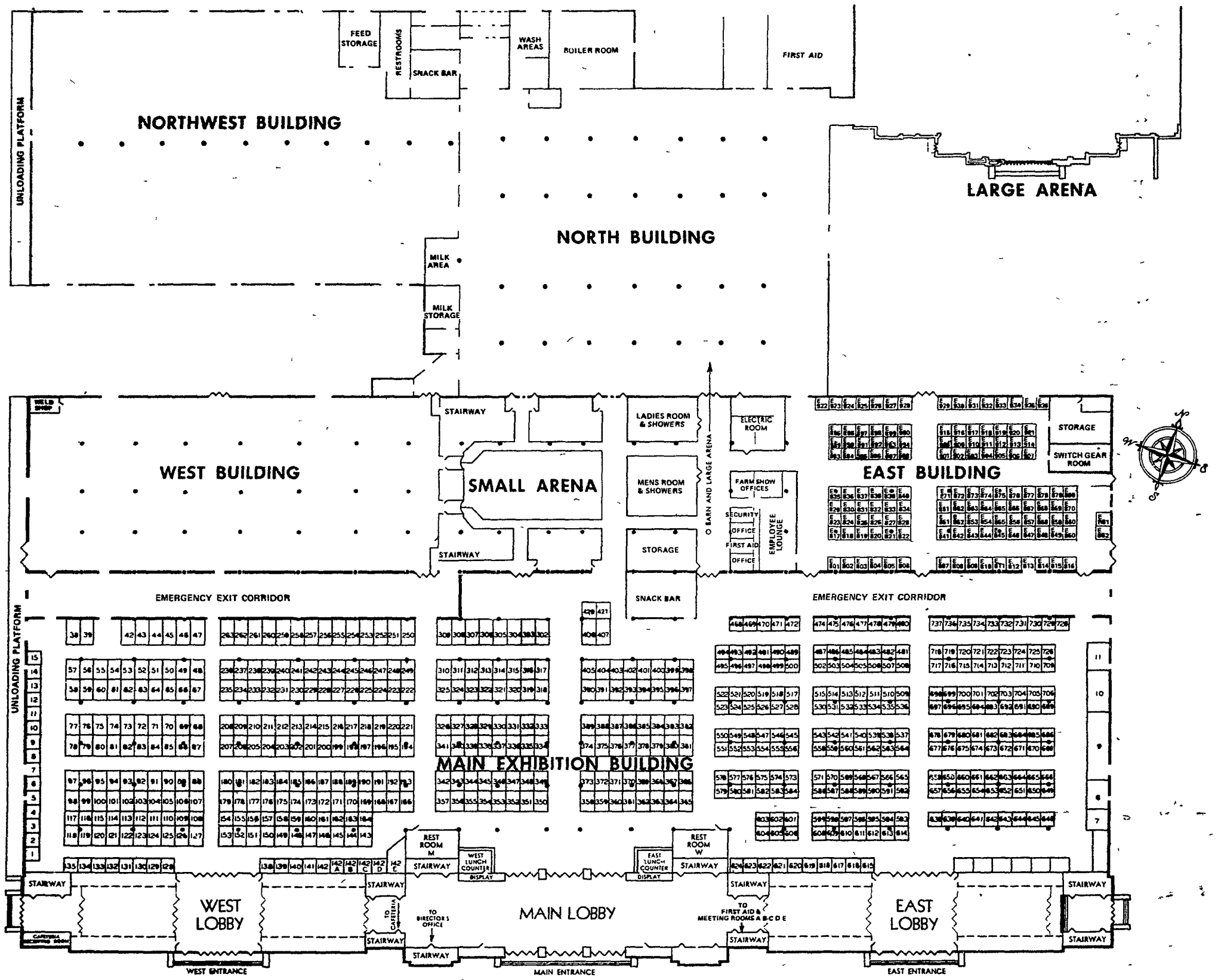


Floor plan of the 1979 Farm Show building

Del-James Farms, Hamburg, operated by James and Delores Adam and children. Here visitors could also see a carousel milking parlor on which the Adams milk 150 head, and calf hutches where the young calves are raised.

Peters Brothers Meat Market, Inc., Lenhartsville. Owned by Donald and Geraldine Peters, this is one of the few remaining country butchers offering full service and a complete line of products made in the Pennsylvania Dutch tradition. Visitors were given a complete tour of the plant from the holding pens, through the slaughter areas, coolers, processing rooms, lard rendering area, smokehouse and the retail store.

Ontelaunee Orchards, Leesport. Here guests were given a tour of a new controlled atmosphere fruit

storage building where fruit from some of the 825 acres of apples, 200 acres of peaches, and 35 acres of other fruit are stored.

Harold and Eleanor Burgert, Blandon. This farm settled in 1733 is one of the oldest farms in the
