Auditionees do not need to make any prior arrangements or appointments.

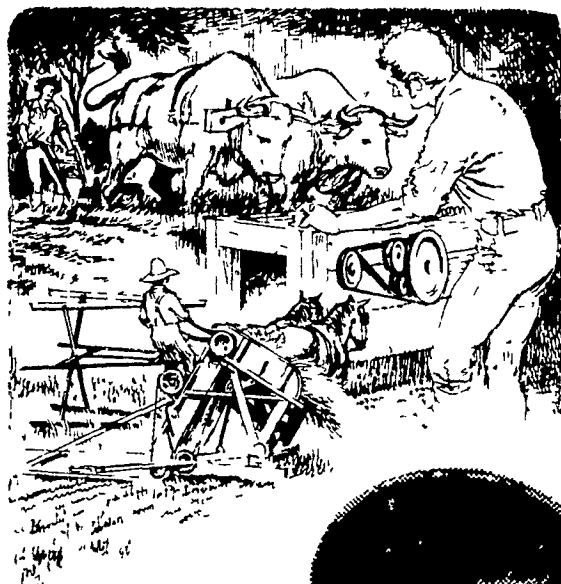
