## Grain inspection fees lowered


NEW YORK, N.Y. Federal fees for inspecting grain in barges, ships and bins will be lowered 121/2 per cent, and hourly rates for weighing services will be lowered 20 per cent, beginning Dec. 3, a U.S. Department of Agriculture official said.

Leland E. Bartelt, administrator of the department's Federal Grain Inspection Service, said operating reserves were created faster than expected in fiscal year 1978, making the reductions possible.

"We are still evaluating other aspects of the fee schedule, including the feasibility of unit and hourly fees for inspection services and charging for standby time at export locations where FGIS provides inspection services on a routine basis, Bartelt said. "We expect to complete these studies by the end of 1978."

Fees will remain the same for original inspections in trucks and rail cars, reinspections and appeal inspections in the U.S., and fees for inspection and weighing services in Canada. The new fee for original inspection of grain in barges, ships, and bins will be \$2.90 per 1,000 bushels, compared to the present fee of \$2.85 per 1,000 bushels.

The new fee for official weighing of grain will be \$12.80 per man-hour for regular time, compared to the present fee of \$16 per man-hour. Similar reductions have been made in the overtime rates. The new fees are expected to provide enough income to cover the costs of providing the service, as required by the U.S. Grain Standards Act., The fee schedule was published in the Federal Register on Nov. 8.
