WASHINGTON, D.C.—The Labor Department recently completed its action revoking 928 provisions of safety standards deemed unnecessary or unrelated to job safety and health. Initially, over 1100 standards were indicated for possible revocation last December, but 172 failed to make the final cut.

Assistant Secretary of

Labor Eula Bingham, who heads OSHA, revoked 607 selected general industry standards and 321 special standards. "Unnecessary and overly complex regulations place a tremendous burden on workers, employers, and on the agency's limited inspection resources," Dr. Bingham said.

The revoked standards

made up roughly 10 per cent of the word volume of OSHA's standards, and were finalized as the result of extensive public review and comment. Commenting on the final action, Dr. Bingham added that it was

one step "in our efforts to respond to the desires of President Carter and Congress that OSHA eliminate the so-called 'nuisance' standards and to reduce and simplify existing government regulations."

Beef sale held

ARENDSVILLE — The Adams County Beef Producers Association held its third annual "Freedom of Choice" calf sale recently at the South Mountain Fairgrounds in Arendtsville. Forty-eight head were sold with the average price per hundred weight \$74.64.

Thirty-eight steer calves averaged 493 pounds and 75.52 per hundred weight. Four registered heifer calves averaged 400 pounds and 81.56 per hundred weight, while six other heifers averaged 475 pounds and 64.44 per hundred weight.

The champion cross-bred steer and champion Angus steer were both consigned by Spring Bottom Farms, Fairfield, and sold to Titus Lefever, Manheim and Robbie Hay, Gettysburg. The champion cross-bred

heifer was consigned by Brown's Ranch, Gettysburg and bought by Jim Reichart, Littlestown. The champion Hereford steer was consigned by Pigeon Hill Farms, Abbottstown, and purchased by R. Claire Wolf, Biglerville. The champion Polled Hereford steer from Huckleberry Hall Farms, was bought by John Yorlets Jr., Mechanicsburg. The champion Polled Hereford heifer was consigned by Glen Cary Farms, Damascus, and purchased by David Shultz, Mechanicsburg. Champion Charolais steer from Lost Nation Stock Farm, Orrtanna, was bought by R. Claire Wolf, Biglerville.

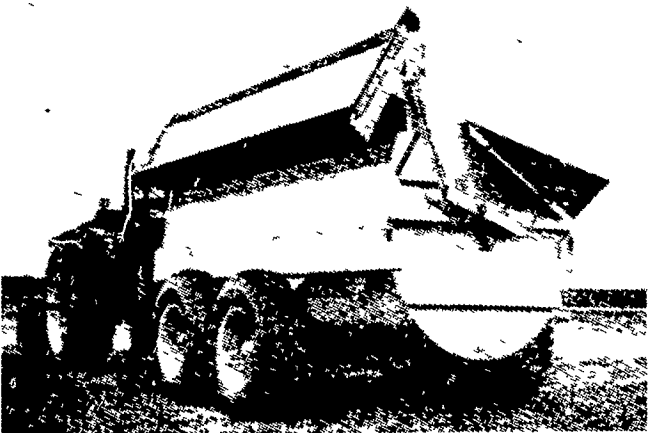
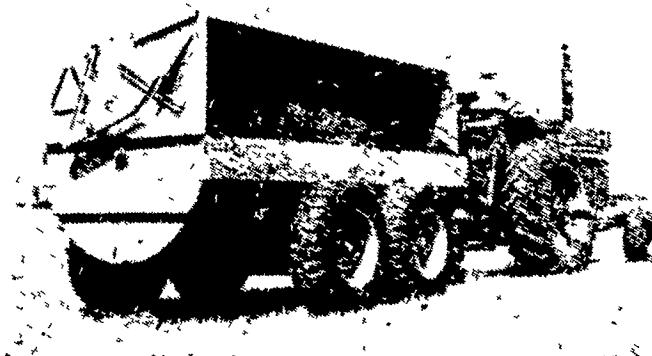
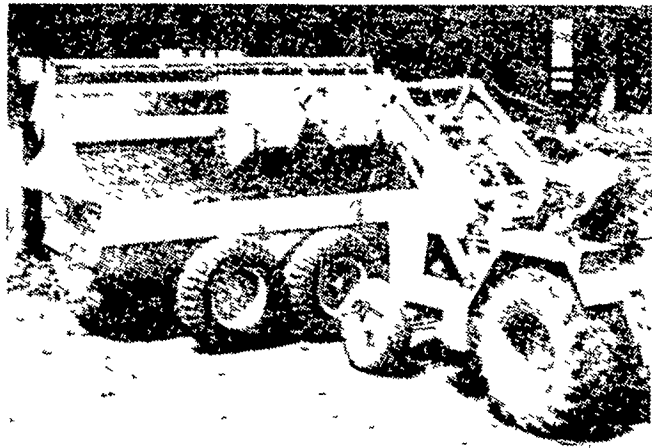
Volume buyer was Stan Musser of Manchester who purchased 8 lots.

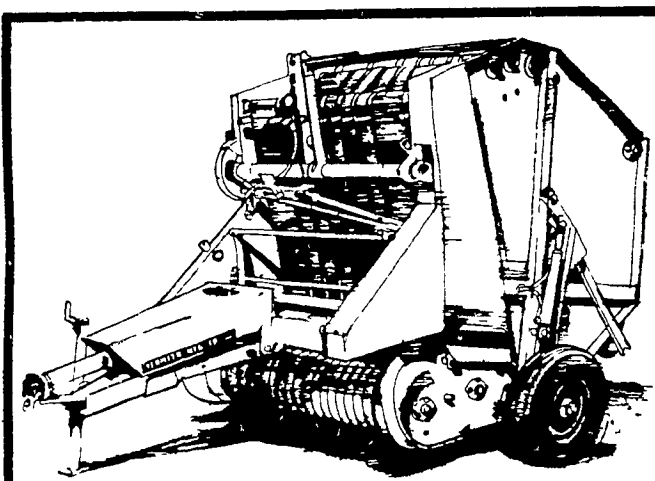

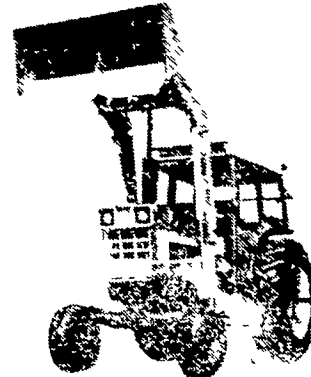
