WASHINGTON, D.C. -President Carter has vetoed the Countercyclical Meat Import Bill which is supported by the American Farm Bureau Federation.

The Bill would have decreased beef imports when domestic supplies were high, and increased imports when domestic supplies were low.

Rural crime prevention program announced

HARRISBURG Agriculture Secretary Kent Shelhamer announced a new program for rural crime prevention at a recent General Session of the Pennsylvania Farmers' Association's annual meeting.

The crime prevention program will initiate an

identification process for farm machinery pearing a Pennsylvania driver's license number and the prefix PA. Farm machinery, and any personal property, inscribed with the new identification number can then be quickly identified by a computer through the Department of Transportation.
