"We stress the family atmosphere," says Mrs. Jean Pulinka, Shared Living Coordinator. "This is not a boarding home situation where the older person stays in his room all day. We want the older person to be accepted as part of the family."

Some commitment is required on the part of those who open up their homes. They are asked to provide a furnished bedroom and do the meals, laundry and cleaning, although the older person may help if he or she wishes.

But there are also many safeguards built into the program. A home provider is able to screen any person to decide whether he or she would fit into his home. The coordinator works closely

with the home and the individual to ensure a satisfactory arrangement for everybody concerned. And there is no set time limit for the arrangement so that if family circumstances change there is no ongoing commitment.

Many families that have shared their homes with an elderly person enjoy the contact with another generation. They like having a grandparent figure around and enjoy the contact with the past that this provides. There is also a financial remuneration for the family.

Your light glows in the shining eyes of a toddler. hands clasped before the overwhelming beauty of a newly-lit tree, manger scene shining beneath.


Your light shines in the happy eyes of a lonely person, remembered with a gift of thoughtfulness, a kind word, a chance to share Christmas with the family of man.
