Horse imports from Belgium and West Germany banned

NEW YORK, N.Y. -Breeding age horses from Belgium and the Federal Republic of Germany can no longer be imported into the United States because contagious equine metritis, a breeding disease of horses, has been diagnosed in those countries.

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) placed a similar ban on horse imports from the United Kingdom, Ireland, France and Australia in September 1977, when this newly discovered equine disease was found in those countries. However, it was later found that the disease was introduced in Kentucky Thoroughbred breeding stock by two stallions from France that had been imported just prior to the ban.

Soviets bullish on our cattle

WASHINGTON, D.C. - The United States completed a record sale of breeding cattle to the Russians in mid-October when it shipped 450 Santa Gertrudis beef cattle to Moscow. An earlier shipment contained 95 dairy breeding bulls-85 Holstein and 10 Brown Swiss, bringing the total to 545 head. According to USDA's Foreign Agricultural Service, the largest previous sale of breeding cattle to the Soviets was 218 in 1976.

Quarantines and testing in Kentucky by State, industry and USDA veterinarians limited and controlled this outbreak. Strict sanitary measures in the breeding sheds and continual testing of possibly exposed Thoroughbred mares are now being used to eradicate the disease organism from affected U.S. horses. The ban will only apply to breeding stock; geldings and horses under two years of age will not be included in this action.

Equine metritis is a highly contagious genital infection of horses. The stallion is a carrier of the disease organism and usually can be freed of the bacteria by disinfection followed by treatment of the genitalia with specific antibiotics. The organism readily infects mares, causing early abortion or failure to con-

Antibiotic treatment is used to free mares of the infection, but treatment is not always successful.


