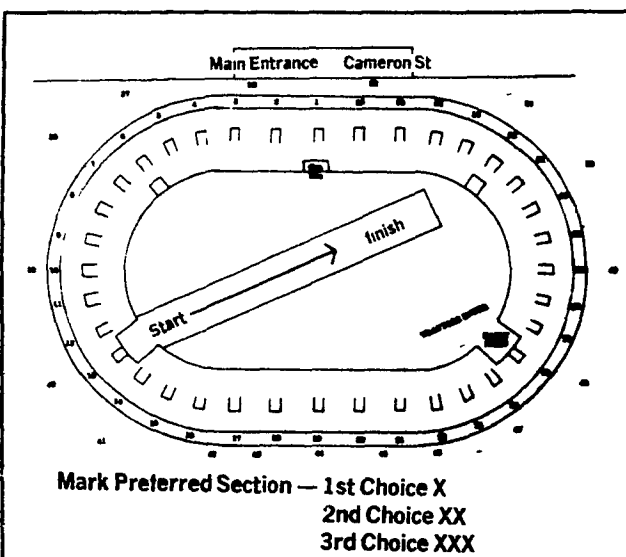

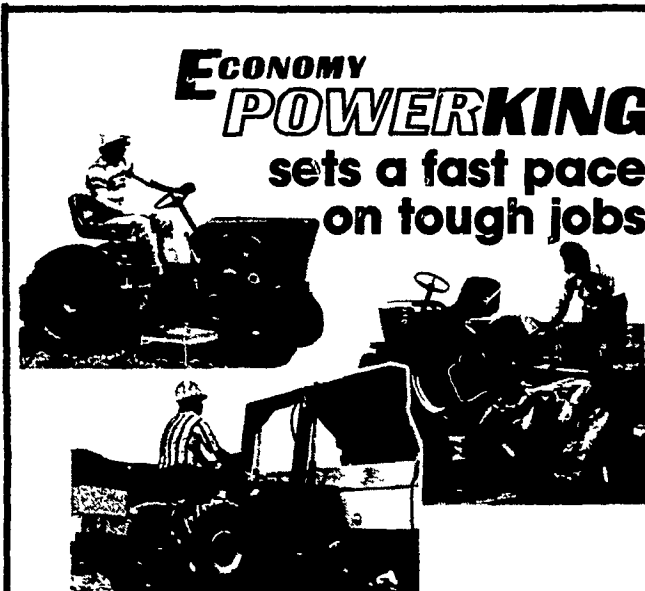
PSU offers gardening course
