


# Cumberland County

NOVEMBER 1978

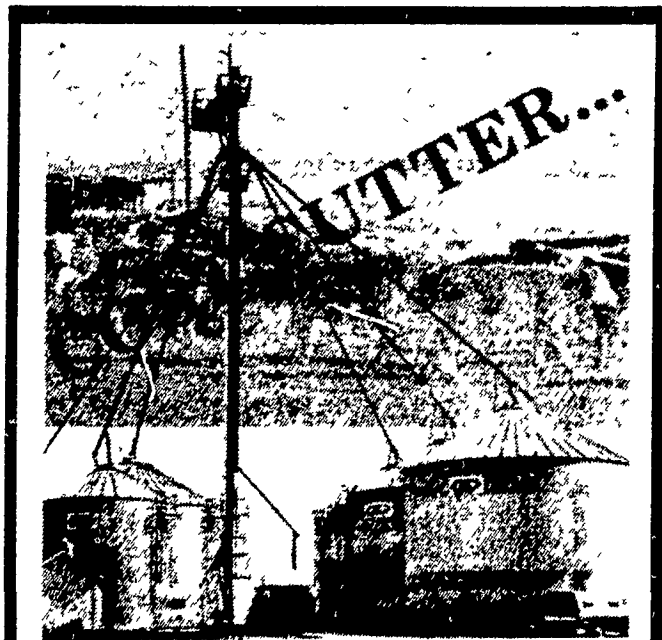
Cumberland County Dairy Herd Improvement records show that 6,189 cows in 102 herds were on production testing in November according to Duane G. Duncan, county agent. Of the 84 herds on DHIA, 27 herds had an average fat production of 150 pounds per cow per day for the month. During 114 completed their 305 day lactation with 600 lbs. of butterfat.
