Young's names contest winners





(Continued from Page 28) can complete and keep for his own records; the option of receiving major county data merely by checking a box on the form; a time extension which will be granted farmers who request it; and an improved mailing list, and a "Were You Counted," campaign for any farmer inadvertently omitted.

The law which requires farmers to answer the census items also protects the privacy of answers. Since 1900, census report forms have been confidential by law. They may be seen only by sworn Census employees and may be used only for statistical totals. Even other government agencies cannot obtain o use the reports made by an farm operator. Neither ca anyone use legal means o obtain a copy of the repor retained by the operator n his files.

Farm operators who d not receive a form during th first week of January should request one from the Burea of the Census, 1201 East 101 Street, Jeffersonville, In diana 47131.
