

If Mr. Lawson had sold his corn at 62 cents a bushel (the Government's Average Illinois Farm Price on Dec. 15, 1930, which is considerably lower than prices prevailing in the early fail) and had allowed himself'3 cents a bushel to cover marketing cost and \$200.00 to cover amount paid out for taxes on land, his corn would have paid him a profit amounting to \$2026.72, or a return of 13.5 per cent on his land investment. This return could be greatly increased and the 3-cents per-bushel marketing cost saved by converting the corn into marketable livestock.
