

## Farmers can expect little help in solving environmental issues

MIAMI BEACH, Fla. - Farmers can expect little if any, help from government agencies and environmentalists in solving key problems in the area of natural and environmental resources.

That was the conclusion reached by Farm Bureau members during a resources conference at the American Farm Bureau Federation's 60th annual convention here on January 16.

John McGuire, chief of the U.S. Forest Service, defended that agency's recent recommendation that Congress designate as wilderness some 15 million more acres of public land. This would close those areas to motor vehicles, power tools, and rangeland improvement. Ranchers say this would, in effect, kill any grazing possibilities.

McGuire further dismayed his audience when he stated, "The potential for additional wilderness is extensive."

Another speaker who supported regulatory restrictions on food producers was Keith Higginson, commissioner of the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation. He supported the Reclamation Act of 1902, which limits acreage ownership by a farm receiving irrigation water

from a federal project to 160 acres.

Higginson outlined changes his agency will propose in the law to expand the acreage limit to 320 acres—still unacceptable under Farm Bureau policy—but require the owner live within 50 miles of the land.

Mrs. Rita Gray Beatty, author of the book "The Great DDT Myth," and Dr. Tom Fisher, extension entomologist at the University of New Hampshire, said current bans on DDT and other useful pesticides are based on uninformed statements and incorrect research figures.

They called on Farm Bureau members to unite in disapproving those claims and in communicating their production plight to consumers, whose food costs, they stated, are being driven up by the needless pesticide restrictions.
