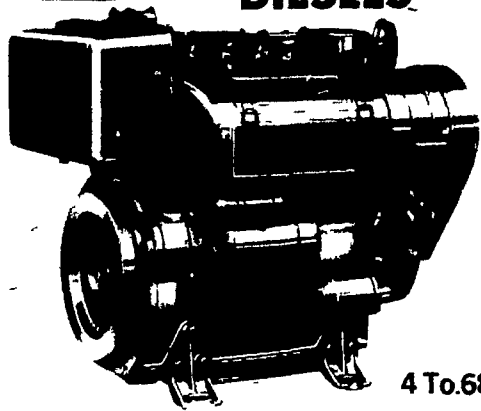

The first-ever Keystone Pork Congress was initiated and organized by the Pennsylvania Pork Producers Council. The idea for it was conceived last Summer.

Interested swine farmers and others in allied businesses are invited to attend. Banquet tickets are required, however.

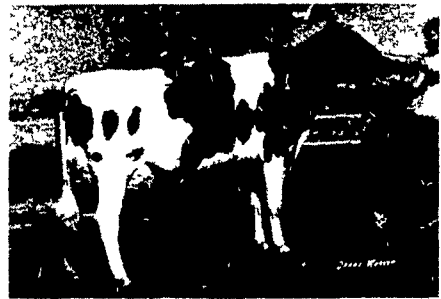

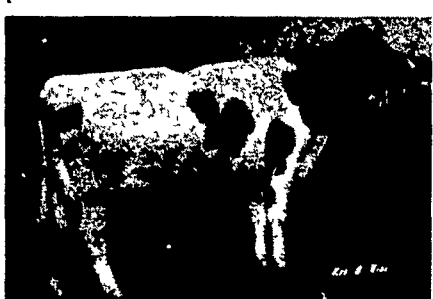

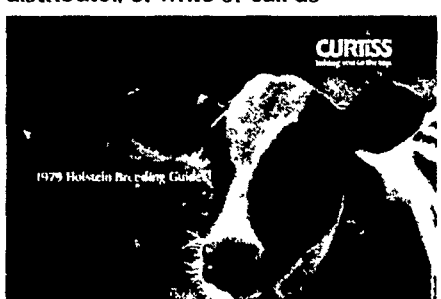
