

Md. cattlemen's seminar set for Feb. 20

COLLEGE PARK, Md. - The fourth annual statewide cattlemen's winter seminar will be held February 20. Activities will run from 9:30 a.m. to 3:15 p.m. at the Brethren Service Center in New Windsor. Lunch will be served at 12:30 p.m. and is included in the \$5 registration fee.

Co-sponsors are again the Cooperative Extension Service at the University of Maryland, the Maryland Cattlemen's Association, and the Division of Marketing in the state Department of Agriculture.

The meeting site is located in New Windsor at the northern end of Main Street on the east side of town.

Master of ceremonies for the day's program will be J. Burton Eller, Jr., of Alexandria, Va. Eller is associate director for the Washington, D.C., office of the National Cattlemen's Association.

Dr. John B. Peters, associate professor of animal science at West Virginia University, will lead off the program by speaking on "Breeding Beef Cattle by Appointment." Dr. Peters' speech will be a prelude to a panel discussion moderated by Lawrason Sayre of Waffle Hill Farm at

Churchville. The panel discussion topic is "Experience with Artificial Insemination and Estrus Synchronization." Discussion will deal with how cattle breeding can be done all at one time.

Taking part in the panel discussion will be Dr. Emmitt Full of Mt. Airy, a veterinarian; Fred Harner of North American Breeders at Berryville, Va.; Gordon C. Keys of Olney; and James Reid of Berlin.

According to Dr. William E. Kunkle, Extension livestock specialist at the University of Maryland in College Park, there are at least three advantages for synchronizing breeding, compared with conventional artificial insemination: Reduced labor required to inseminate cattle; Less expertise required in detecting cattle in heat; and Flexibility in scheduling the breeding of cattle. "Synchronizing the estrus cycle in beef cattle has the potential of increasing the use of artificial insemination. Top sires are available to cattlemen through artificial insemination at a lower cost, as compared to owning them," says Kunkle. Dr. Kunkle is coor-

dinator of the winter seminar again this year. headquarterd in Kansas City, Mo.

Afterward, the Maryland Cattlemen's Association will hold its annual business meeting. Directors and officers will be elected. Appropriate industry exhibits will be on display throughout the day.
