hoot if it's not implemented," Schadel said. Before application is made, the district will have to determine that enough support is there. That's why the exact boundaries of the

target area are uncertain, according to Warren Archibald, conservationist with the Soil Conservation Service in Lancaster. Most areas of the county already have 30 to 35 per cent of the resident farmers

on the district cooperator roles. Schadel said making the 50 per cent requirement by the third year would mean obtaining only an additional 15 per cent, which should be possible.

Aaron Stauffer, the Ephrata area farmer and restaurateur who is the district's chairman, reminded members, "State law says if you are not a cooperator, you are in violation of the law now."

In addition to its status as the state's worst agriculturally tainted river, the Conestoga has its location and local importance making it likely to qualify. Ralph Matticks, SCS

resource conservationist, explained that the number of people in Lancaster, downstream from the source of target area, and their partial reliance on the river for drinking water will be determining factors.

Matticks said the amount of soil lost through surface flow is the main factor. Chemicals also are washed into the river with the soil.

The program could last as long as 15 years. In other years, if Congress appropriates more money, Lancaster might be able to submit other areas for consideration. Other areas in the state also will be asked to submit applications.



**\*WHAT IS AN "ENERGY-PAK" OXYGEN CONTROLLED FEED STORAGE SYSTEM?**




