Wildlife federation wants rules on chemicals tightened

WASHINGTON, D.C. – The National Wildlife Federation has called on the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency to tighten the regulations the EPA proposed last Fall for the control of poisonous chemicals and other toxic substances.

The new rules, NWF said, should place a higher priority on safety than on "alleged benefits" of new compounds. The NWF recommendations were contained in a nine-page study of EPA's Proposed Implementation Approach to Toxic Substances Control. which, the citizens conservation group said, showed "no sense of urgency." The EPA guidelines, NWF complained, placed too much emphasis on "information gathering ... procedures, methods, mechanisms and approaches" and not enough on "corrective and preventive action."

EPA rules, when finally adopted, should require manufacturers of new substances to pass EPAdesigned safety tests, the conservation group said. Otherwise, NWF pointed out, the burden of proving that the compound is risky would fall on EPA and the EPA would be able to prevent the manufacture of a potentially harmful substance only by going to court.

Unless EPA requires pre-

testing of a new substance, said NWF, the nation could again suffer such costly environmental disasters as the Kepone contamination of the James River and-Chesapeake Bay in Virginia, and the PCB contamination of the Hudson River and the

> Great Lakes. In another action, NWF has petitioned EPA to design rules to regulate all solid waste disposal in the nation's wetlands.

According to the NWF petition, EPA should clearly establish that solid waste and garbage disposal in wetlands are subject to requirements of the Clean Water Act, which prohibit the unauthorized discharge of any pollutant into waters of the U.S.
